



Striving for a School of Kindness

Subject: Addressing Inappropriate Use of Racist Words and Name Calling

Dear Parents/Guardians,

As educators, it is our duty to foster an inclusive and respectful environment for every child at our school. Today, I am reaching out to seek your support in an important matter that requires our collective action: addressing the inappropriate use of racist words and name calling among our children.

At our school, we strongly believe in promoting equality, respect, and acceptance of diversity. We are committed to ensuring that our children feel safe and supported, regardless of their race, ethnicity, or background. It has come to our attention that some children have been using racist words and engaging in name calling, which is contrary to our values and expectations.

We want to make it clear that racist comments cannot be dismissed or accepted as mere "banter." We firmly state that our school has a zero-tolerance policy towards any form of racism or discrimination. We believe in fostering an environment where every child feels valued, respected, and safe.

- 1. Open Dialogue: Initiate conversations about racism, equality, and respect. Encourage your child to ask questions and express their thoughts. This demonstrates that you are available to address any concerns they may have.
- 2. Lead by Example: Be a positive role model by maintaining respectful language and behaviour both at home and in the wider community. Children often mirror the attitudes and actions they observe from their parents and caregivers.
- Encourage Empathy: Foster empathy by encouraging your child to consider the impact of their words and actions on others. Teach them about the importance of kindness, understanding, and treating everyone with equal respect
- **4. Media Literacy**: Critically assess the media your child consumes. Encourage them to question and challenge instances of racial stereotypes or discrimination they may come across. This will develop their critical thinking skills and promote a mindful approach to media consumption.

Furthermore, we are implementing several measures at school to address this issue. Our staff will be engaging in anti-racism training to enhance their knowledge and understanding of these matters. In addition, we will be hosting workshops and discussions for pupils, providing them with the necessary tools to navigate conversations about race respectfully.

Lastly, we kindly request that if your child experiences or witnesses any form of racism or name calling, please inform us immediately. Our school has clear procedures in place to address such incidents, and we are committed to ensuring the safety and wellbeing of all our children.
